- Open to members of a GAP Member Club with a GAP/USGA Handicap Index of 7.0 or lower.
- 138 players; field includes the exempt players entered and those who qualified at BMW Philadelphia Amateur Championship Qualifying conducted at Burlington Country Club (May 11), Elkview Country Club (May 19), Running Deer Golf Club (May 22) and Heidelberg Country Club (May 25).
- 36-hole stroke play qualifying on Day One. 32 players advance into match play. A sudden-death playoff will be held to break any ties for qualifying positions. Match play includes two rounds scheduled for Days Two and Three. The 36-hole final will take place on the last day. The defending champion must qualify for match play. The individual stroke-play qualifying rounds count toward the Silver Cross Award standings. This is a William Hyndman, III Player of the Year points and World Amateur Golf Ranking event.

LANCASTER, Pa. — Barbin brothers beware.

Zach is walking through the front door at home after winning the most prestigious prize in Philadelphia golf. And Andrew, Austin and Evan, get ready to hear about it.

Zach Barbin, a senior at Liberty University, won the 120th BMW Philadelphia Amateur Championship Saturday at Lancaster Country Club (par 70, 6,694 yards). He defeated fellow collegiate Michael O'Brien, who is heading to Florida Gulf Coast University for a grad year, 5&3, in the 36-hole Final.

Barbin, a Loch Nairn Golf Club member, is the first player representing a public facility to win in the event's history. Public courses were welcomed into GAP in 1994.

“If I could take the trophy home with me, I’d put it on the table and tell Austin this is bigger than the GAP Junior [trophy] he won,” said a smiling Barbin. “No. Seriously. We support each other and we encourage each other. I know they are so happy for me like I was for Austin last year [Austin won multiple events en route to the GAP Junior Player of the Year in 2019]. My older brother [Andrew] already sent me a nice text. We all love each other. I’m not going to brag or anything.”

O'Brien, a Makefield Highland Golf Club member, was also looking to become the first player to represent a public facility and win. The 22-year-old recently graduated from St. Joseph's University with a degree in sports marketing.

“It was an awesome week. I didn't pack [enough clothes] to be here until Saturday,” said O'Brien, a Cincinnati, Ohio resident. “It was

[Today], it didn't show up. If I had my best stuff, I still don't know if I could've beaten Zach. He played awesome, especially on the front nine of the second 18.”

The opening 18 holes seesawed with only three holes halved. Barbin led 1-up after the first round. O'Brien, however, appeared to grab the momentum when he capped the morning session with a 22-foot birdie on No. 18 (par 4, 466 yards). He ripped a 7-iron from 175 yards.

The first lap at Lancaster took the players only two hours and 50 minutes. Players, once again, were allowed to use motorized carts per the Association's COVID-19 policy. With inclement weather in the forecast, the finalists returned to the course just 10 minutes later.

Barbin returned red hot.

In relation to par, Barbin, with usual match play concessions, played the last 15 holes in 4 under. He never trailed in a match prior to the Final all week. In the Final, he was 1-down after No. 6 (par 3, 175 yards), but immediately responding by winning No. 7.

Originating in 1897, the Amateur Championship is the Association's premiere Major. It is a four-day event that distinguishes the best Amateur golfer in the Philadelphia region.

Four qualifying events, as well as pre-existing player exemptions, determine the Amateur Championship field. On the event's first day, more than 130 players compete in a 36-hole qualifier to earn one of 32 spots in a match play draw. Two of those 32 players then must advance through four rounds of golf to gain a spot in the Amateur Final, which traditionally takes place on the day prior to Father's Day. The Final also typically coincides with the third day of the U.S. Open.

Philadelphia Cricket Club's Albert H. Smith captured the first Amateur Championship by defeating J.D. Winsor of Merion Cricket Club in 37 holes at Bala Golf Club. The event's format switched to medal play in 1938. J. Wood Platt went on to win two consecutive Amateurs under that format. His brother William "Zimmer" Platt earned the 1940 title at Philadelphia Cricket Club by being the only competitor to finish all 72 holes. The event's format reverted back to match play the following year.

The Amateur Championship wasn't contested from 1943-45 because of World War II. Overall, 37 courses have served as host sites. BMW has served as the event's presenting sponsor since 2015.

The winner of the BMW Philadelphia Amateur Championship is presented with the J. Wood Platt Trophy. Its namesake is widely regarded as the most influential figure in the Association's history.

Platt's amateur résumé features seven Amateur Championships and Silver Cross Awards, four Patterson Cups and a Junior Boys' Championship title. He also captured the inaugural U.S. Senior Amateur Championship in 1955. Platt was also a successful administrator in golf. He served as the Association's president on two different occasions.

Platt gave back to the game in many ways. His work resonates in the J. Wood Platt Caddie Scholarship Trust, which provides financial assistance to young men and women hoping to continue their education.
